Farringtons School Early Years Admissions Policy

We operate an inclusion and equality policy and ensure that all children have access to nursery places and services irrespective of their gender, race, disability, religion, belief, or sexual orientation of parents.

Providing government funded places for 3 and 4 year olds.

Admissions details: Parents are encouraged to book early for places by registering their interest and submitting a completed Farringtons Prep School Registration Form.

Places are allocated and subject to availability within the specified age group. Priority will be given to those children transferring to Reception, or to those who wish to take an increased number of sessions before offering spaces to new parents. Priority is then given to those children with a sibling in the school, and then by the length of time the child has been registered for entry to the school.

Deposit: on acceptance of a place at the school, parents are asked to pay a £100.00 deposit which is refundable on the first term's invoice.

Prior to a child attending Farringtons School, parents must:

- Supply a copy of the child's birth certificate.
- Complete and sign the Bromley Council Parental Contract, stating the hours and days that they wish their child to attend. This is an agreement to allow for claiming of the government funded place.

All funded sessions are in line with the Government's Statutory Guidance and Local Authority requirements, and are offered subject to availability. When you register your child for their funded place we will discuss your needs, and as far as possible with availability and staffing arrangements we will accommodate your needs.

You are not obliged to give us notice for the funded hours however, we respectfully ask that you give as much notice as possible whilst also paying due regard to our notice period for non-funded hours.

Your child may lose their funded entitlement if they have 3 weeks consecutive absence in any one term.

The funded offer and charges

All settings registered to accept government funding must have a funded offer for 2-, 3- and 4-year-olds.
